The Redskins slipped into the playoffs with a 9-7 record (7-7-2 against-the-spread), but they almost shouldn't have bothered as they were bounced 35-14 by the Seahawks in the Wild Card round. Todd Collins started for Washington in place of the injured Jason Campbell in that contest, but Campbell is recovered from his knee injury and will take back the starter's gig this season. Campbell is still a work in progress at the position, as he posted a QB rating of just 77.6 last year, with 2700 yards passing, 12 TD strikes and 11 interceptions in 13 games. He'll need to take a step forward - and stay healthy - this year to lock down his job and ensure his backup doesn't steal the spotlight once again. Clinton Portis returns as Washington's top threat in the backfield; the veteran running back rushed for 1262 yards and 11 touchdowns last season. Tight end Chris Cooley (786 yards, eight touchdowns in 2007) is now one of the best in the league at his position, while Santana Moss and Antwaan Randle-El are the team's deep threats. Washington scored the fewest points in the NFC East last season, but new head coach Jim Zorn (a former QB guru with Seattle) will concentrate on the offense. In fact, the team used its top three draft picks this year on offensive players, wide receivers Devin Thomas and Malcolm Kelly and tight end Fred Davis. Washington's defense remains mostly intact, although Greg Blache has taken over from Gregg Williams as the coordinator. That unit should still be a strength as the 'Skins gun for the playoffs again.
